LG'S thin HDTV—At just 6/9 mm in width, this is one of the world's thinnest LCD TVs ever designed. The mystery TV (its name will be revealed later) also boasts a thin 10 mm bezel and a 240-block local dimming LED backlight with pixel compensation. [Photo above]

3D HDTVs—Flat-screen television sets presenting the world in 3D, from Sony, LG, and Samsung.

Smartbooks—Tablet netbooks combining the smart phone's constant Internet connectivity and long battery life with the classic shape and keyboard of a laptop. Lenovo's Skylight is one such smartbook.
